In response, GUHEM (Gökmen Space and Aviation Training Center), in collaboration with the Asia Pacific Network of Science & Technology Centres (ASPAC), is proud to announce the ASPAC Masterclass for Emerging Leaders (AMEL) with the theme "Space4All: Empowering Public Engagement and Building Space Awareness." The event aims to develop the capacity of young professionals to engage with the public on space-related issues, build space awareness, and leverage space technologies for the benefit of all.

The Masterclass focuses on equipping emerging leaders from science museums and learning centers with the skills and knowledge to design programs, exhibitions, and educational activities that connect the public to space technologies and their applications in everyday life. In addition, it offers an opportunity to strengthen networks within the Asia-Pacific region, fostering collaboration on public space education and outreach.

Objectives

- 1. To empower professionals from science museums and lifelong learning centers to raise public awareness of space technologies and their impact on daily life.
- 2. To promote the exchange of knowledge and experiences in designing public engagement activities that inspire communities to engage with space science and exploration.
- 3. To strengthen the network of science centers working to build space awareness, foster public engagement, and promote global space literacy.
- 4. To encourage the development of innovative and inclusive approaches for engaging the public in space-related topics, ensuring that space truly becomes accessible for all.

KEY AGENDA

This four-day ASPAC Masterclass for Emerging Leaders (AMEL) will provide an in-depth exploration of public engagement strategies and the role of space awareness in science communication. Through interactive workshops, lectures, and group discussions, participants will gain insights on:

- How space technologies are already integrated into our lives and how to communicate these connections effectively.
- Developing and managing space-themed exhibitions and activities that capture the public's imagination.
- Tools and approaches for building space awareness across diverse communities.
- Strategies for creating inclusive public engagement programs that address equity and access in space education.

Participants will collaborate in teams to design innovative public engagement strategies and will present their ideas to peers and experts for feedback.

Target Audience

The Masterclass is aimed at young professionals from ASPAC member organizations, including curators, educators, and staff involved in developing science exhibitions and public engagement activities. Eligible participants are:

- Aged 25–45 years and currently employed in science museums, learning centers, or related organizations.
- Limited to two participants per organization, with only 35 seats available
